For those who questioned the text he read from Paul's declaration Phil 4:13 and applied it to us all. "I can do all things through Christ which strengthens me," and again from Peter's comment in 1Pet 3:15, "but sanctify the Lord God in your hearts; and be ready to give answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and with fear."

Actually the first answer is given to a small group of evangelist, whereas the second and third can be applied to all Christians.

Then he added, "There is a problem in the church today. It is subtle, but it is there. People are telling us, 'wait, hold it, you don't know enough. You haven't been to the beginners class, you don't even have a Bible. You haven't learned to pray. You can't share your faith with someone, you aren't ready."

But the truth is, that all these things can help, but the Holy Spirit uses a witness whose heart is motivated by love.

Do a little thinking about your witness and watch for opportunities. That way you will be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason for the hope that is in you with meekness and with fear.

If you meet a person who is spiritually inclined your conversation can get rather deep quite soon, but actually the test is speaking of a person that "asketh you" and then says to do your explaining (or teaching) with a meek attitude and with respect for the other person, willing to listen to him, and then turn his thoughts toward a higher truth.

I'm afraid of losing my friends and relatives.
I don't know how.

In the picture of new students above you will see no sign of these excuses. Things are deep but light enough to keep the students light and happy.

If you wish to experience the level of joy so many others have found, you will have to drop those excuses for not sharing your faith. You will have to practice obedience to the great commission. Not only will this impact the lives of your loved ones, giving the Holy Spirit the opportunity to draw them to Christ, but you will experience a new depth in your relationship with God. One you have not had before. After all, God promised, "I will be with you." Ex. 3:12. Then just wait to see what God will do with an ordinary person like you, who is obedient in sharing his faith.

I can't seem to break the silence of so many thousands of fire victims these past months. The most recent in California is in the Santa Cruz Mountains. It has now scorched more than 2,250 acres, destroyed a home and buildings, and triggered evacuations. The triple-digit temperatures and dry conditions are driving the explosive blaze. This particular area has not been hit with a major blaze in about 15 years. In the Bay area, 8 record temperature highs were set Monday, 104 made it the second warmest September high since 1958.

In Sonoma County more than 1000 fire fighters have gained the upper hand on the Sawmill fire which started Sunday. Burning 10 miles east of Cloverdale, the blaze is 1,500 acres so far.

The Soberanes fire in Las Padres National Forest continues to burn. This blaze began July 22 and so far has consumed 128,380 acres!



While these and more fires continue to burn, the other side of the U.S. is getting flooded. Last week Wisconsin got their share of rain. One person was killed after a mudslide destroyed a home. They declared a disaster emergency for 13 counties.

This week Cedar Rapids Iowa is seeing the worst flooding since 2008. It forced 10,000 residents out of their homes and businesses. The river that runs through Cedar Rapids reached its second-highest peak ever on Tuesday. So far the damage is fairly minor flooding because "contractors erected nearly 10 miles of

temporary barriers in just days, and 250,000 sandbags were filled and placed to protect homes and businesses. The city had some of the Hesco barriers for years for flood protection but this marks the first time they have been deployed in Cedar Rapids."



Hong Kong CNN: Heavy rains from Typhoon Megi caused a landslide Wednesday that left 27 people missing in China's Zhejiang province, state-run media reported.

Megi made landfall earlier Wednesday in China's Fujian province, less than 24 hours after it devastated Taiwan. Four people died and at least 524 were injured in Taiwan after the powerful storm slammed into the island's northeastern coastline on Tuesday afternoon. More than 3.8 million homes were left without electricity on Tuesday night after some 38 inches (one meter) of rain fell in Yilan County, according to Taiwan's Central News Agency.

By Wednesday, more than a million were still waiting for their power or water to be restored, with the total damage toll sitting around \$4.78 million. The typhoon was the third storm system to hit the island in just two weeks, lashing Taiwan with winds up to 143 miles per hour (230 kilometers per hour).

On September 14, Typhoon Meranti killed 30 people and injured many more in the island's south and collapsed over 900 homes (\$2.63 billion in damage), followed by typhoon Malakas which drenched Taiwan's north on September 16. Typhoon Meranti was the strongest storm seen in the region since 2013, leaving hundreds of thousands of Taiwanese homes damaged or without power in its wakes.

And so it goes, one storm after another, one fire after another? Debris lying for miles along roadsides. Children crying, parents dazed. If it would just stop raining or send a little to the California coast! But little relief in sight.

CNN: In a bizarre consequence of Eid al Adha (Festival of Sacrifice) celebrations in Bangladesh, animal sacrifices have combined with heavy rains leaving the streets awash with blood. Shocking photos emerged from the capital, Dhaka, Wednesday that showed residents wading through streets flooded with a mix of

animal blood (and backed up sewer toxins and poisons) and rain water.

This was one of the largest man-made ugly pictures I have ever seen. Never have I seen such a sight. I can't show you the pictures as they are blocked by financial arrangements. Literally red rivers flowing in the streets.

If coming from the South, plan on 45 minute drive north from Bakersfield. Take Hwy 99. Passing through Bakersfield on Hwy 99 you will come to a cut-off to the right marked Hwy 65 to Porterville and Sequoia Parks. Take Hwy 65 north (the only way you can) past Ducor to Terra Bella, Ave. 95, (this is a stop signal). Turn East (right) on Ave. 95 & go about 3 miles to Rd. 256. Turn left (North) onto Rd. 256. Continue one long block to Ave. 100. Ave. 100 goes only to the right (East). Look for a red house on the left about one block from the corner of Rd. 256 and Ave. 100. The address is 25810 Avenue 100, Terra Bella, CA 93270.

If coming from the North, plan on 11/2 hour from Fresno. Continue South on Hwy 99 to Pixley. Watch close; it is but a little distance from Tipton. Take Ave 96 East to Hwy 65. Ave 96 will become Ave 95. (Continue east past the town of Terra Bella on Ave. 95 about three miles to Rd. 256. (There is Tuff Products at this' corner). Turn left (North) on to Rd. 256. Continue one long block to Ave. 100. Avenue 100 goes only to the right (East). Look for a red house on the left about one block from the corner of Rd. 256 and Ave. 100. Address is 25810 Avenue 100, Terra Bella, CA 93270. Campground entrance is on east side of house.
