ANOTHER HEALTH NUGGET

Are you a person who has adopted health reform into your life but are still experiencing health problems? There are many people eating a "plant-based" diet who still do not feel well. It is possible that the underlying cause is Leaky Gut Syndrome.

Intestinal Permeability

A possible cause of leaky gut is increased intestinal permeability or intestinal hyperpermeability.

That could happen when tight junctions in the gut, which control what passes through the lining of the small intestine, don't work properly. That could let substances leak into the bloodstream.

People with celiac disease and Crohn's disease experience this. "Molecules can get across in some cases, such as Crohn's, but we don't know all the causes," Lee says (Linda A. Lee, MD, a gastroenterologist and director of the Johns Hopkins Integrative Medicine and Digestive Center.) Whether hyperpermeability is more of a contributing factor or a consequence is unclear. WebMD Leaky Gut Syndrome: What is it? - Matt McMillen

Some possible causes for leaky gut include one or more of the following:

- Genetic predisposition
- Stress
- Environmental toxins such as glyphosate herbicide and other chemicals introduced into the environment
- Diet

Symptoms of possible gut permeability include but are not limited to:

- A burning feeling of ulceration in your gut.
- Painful indigestion from the loss of intestinal mucosa.
- Diarrhea
- Gas and bloating from fermentation by overgrown bacteria in your gut.
- Low energy from the reduced ability to draw energy from your food.
- Diagnosed autoimmune condition.
- Food sensitivities.

Most people who think they may have a leaky gut have certain common gastrointestinal symptoms, such as abdominal pain, food sensitivities, bloating and indigestion. These types of symptoms are common and may have many possible explanations, and many of them may injure your intestinal lining. You don't have to have a leaky gut to experience those effects. Clevelandclinic.org *Leaky Gut Syndrome*

Whether you have leaky gut or not, if you are experiencing problems with digestion, energy, food sensitivities, sleep, or focus — diet and lifestyle changes to reduce stress could help.

Some simple suggestions include, but are not limited to:

- Cut out gluten for a couple months. Gluten aggravates gut permeability.
- Eat foods that are more easily digestible until symptoms reside, such as: pseudo-grains like buckwheat, quinoa, amaranth; instead of wheat, oats, rice, soy, corn. Also, substitute sunflower and pumpkin seeds in place of nuts. Coconut milk is a good alternative to dairy and nut milks. These foods can be incorporated back into your diet once symptoms disappear unless you have a diagnosed food allergy, in that case you don't want to reincorporate that food into your diet.
- Soak all legumes, grains, and seeds 12-24 hours, changing the water once or twice, before cooking or eating raw. In the case of seeds, dehydrate the seeds after soaking. Soaking removes much of the lectin, a naturally occurring protein that may play a role in protecting the plant from insects and other herbivores. Too much lectin can irritate the lining of our digestive tract. Cooking removes some of the lectin, however soaking before cooking removes even more. Soaking then sprouting the grains and seeds optimizes their nutrition (all legumes and grains should be cooked thoroughly).
- Cut out refined and overly processed foods for a while such as condiments, vinegar, oils,

- sugar, pre-packaged foods, chips, canned foods, etc. Refined and overly processed foods are truly not a part of our health reform message. The idea is to eat a *whole food* plant-based diet.
- Drink water between meals and not while you're eating. Drinking water or other fluids with a meal dilutes stomach acid, which stops the digestive process until the stomach can rid itself of the fluid. Drinking water between meals helps the mucosa of the gut lining function properly during digestion. Staying properly hydrated throughout the day will eliminate the feeling of thirst and the need to drink while eating.
- It is important not to snack between meals to give your stomach a chance to rest. Wait five hours between meals before you eat again. Eating twice a day is optimal for most people, but if you need to eat three meals a day, make the last meal of the day your lightest meal, like fruit, at least three hours before going to bed. This gives your stomach a chance to rest and heal overnight and will give you better sleep.
- Chew your food thoroughly and do not overeat. Chewing your food thoroughly is easier for your overall digestion and allows your body to optimize the nutrition in the food. Overeating distends the stomach and can paralyze peristalsis action setting up fermentation in the gut, all of which aggravates gut permeability and is a major cause of dyspepsia.



The restoration of health can be a trying journey, but I believe if we take that first step of faith, God will bless our efforts and continue to guide us where we need to be.

Why is our health so important?

The Health to Be Guarded—Since the mind and the soul find expression through the body, both mental and spiritual vigor are in great degree dependent upon physical strength and activity; whatever promotes physical health, promotes the development of a strong mind and a well-balanced character. Without health, no one can as distinctly understand or as completely fulfill his obligations to himself, to his fellow beings, or to his Creator. Therefore, the health should be as faithfully guarded as the character. A knowledge of physiology and hygiene should be the basis of all educational effort. Education 195.1

"In the night I was, I thought, in a room but not in my own house. I was in a city, where I knew not, and I heard explosion after explosion. I rose up quickly in bed, and saw from my window large balls of fire. Jetting out were sparks, in the form of arrows, and buildings were being consumed, and in a very few minutes the entire block of buildings was falling and the screeching and mournful groans came distinctly to my ears. I cried out, in my raised position, to learn what was happening: Where am I? And where are our family circle? Then I awoke. But I could not tell

where I was for I was in another place than home. I said, Oh Lord, where am I and what shall I do?

It was a voice that spoke, 'Be not afraid. Nothing shall harm you.' I was instructed that destruction hath gone forth upon cities. The word of the Lord will be



fulfilled. Isaiah 29:19-24 was repeated. I dared not move, not knowing where I was. I cried unto the Lord, What does it mean? These representations of destruction were repeated. Where am I? 'In scenes I have represented that which will be; but warn My people to cease from putting their trust in men who are not obedient to my warnings and who despise My reproof, for the day of the Lord is right upon the world when evidence shall be made sure. Those who have followed the voices that would turn things upside down will themselves be turned where they cannot see, but will be as blind men.'

(Maranatha, by E.G. White)

This is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent. John 17:3.

Only by knowing God here can we prepare to meet Him at His coming.... But many of those who profess to believe in Christ do not know God. They have only a surface religion. They do not love God; they do not study His character; therefore, they do not know how to trust, how to look and live. They do not know what restful love is, or what it means to walk by faith.... They fail of understanding that it is their duty to receive, in order that they may enrich others.

The world by wisdom knows not God. Many have talked eloquently about Him, but their reasoning brings men no nearer to Him, because they themselves are not in vital connection with Him. Professing themselves to be wise, they become fools. Their knowledge of God is imperfect. ¹⁴The Review and Herald, February 3, 1903.

We cannot by searching find out God, but He has revealed Himself in His Son, who is the brightness of the Father's glory and the express image of His person. If we desire a knowledge of God we must be Christlike.... Living a pure life through faith in Christ as a personal Saviour will bring to the believer a clearer, higher conception of God. 15 That I May Know Him. 9.

Christ is a perfect revelation of God. "No man hath seen God at any time," He says; "the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him." Only by knowing Christ can we know God. And as we behold Him, we shall be changed into His image, prepared to meet Him at His coming....

Now is the time to prepare for the coming of our Lord. Readiness to meet Him cannot be attained in a moment's time. Preparatory to that solemn scene there must be vigilant waiting and watching, combined with earnest work. So, God's children glorify Him. Amid the busy scenes of life their voices will be heard speaking words of encouragement, hope, and faith. All they have and are is consecrated to the Master's service. Thus, they prepare to meet their Lord; and when He comes, they will say, with joy, "This is our God; we have waited for him, and he will save us.... GOD'S WORD A TREASURE HOUSE By Ellen G. White

The Bible is of the highest value because it is the word of the living God. Of all the books in the world it is the most deserving of study and attention, for it is eternal wisdom. The Bible is a history that tells us of the creation of the world and opens to us past centuries. Without it we should have been left to conjecture and fable in regard to the occurrences of the remote past. It reveals to us the Creator of the heavens and the earth, with the universe that He has brought into being, and it sheds a glorious light over the world to come.

The Bible is a field where are concealed heavenly treasures, and they will remain hidden until, by diligent mining, they are



discovered and brought to light. The Bible is a casket containing jewels of inestimable value, which should be so presented as to be seen in their intrinsic luster. But the beauty and excellence of these diamonds of truth are not discerned by the natural eye. The lovely things of the material world are not seen until the sun, dispelling the darkness, floods them with its light. And so with the treasures of God's word; they are not appreciated until they are revealed by the Sun of Righteousness.

The Bible contains a simple and complete system of theology and philosophy. It is the book that makes us wise unto salvation. It tells us of the love of God as shown in the plan of redemption, imparting the knowledge essential for all students--the knowledge of Christ. . . .

God has not only revealed to us the doctrine of the atonement, holding out the hope of eternal life, but His words are the manna from heaven for the soul to feed upon and receive spiritual strength. The Bible is the great standard of right and wrong, clearly defining sin and holiness. Its living principles, running through our lives like threads of gold, are our only safeguard in trial and temptation.

The Holy Scriptures were the essential study in the schools of the prophets, and they should hold the first place in every educational system, for the foundation of all right education is a knowledge of God. Used as a textbook in our schools, the Bible will do for mind and morals what cannot be done by books of science and philosophy. As a book to discipline and strengthen the intellect, to ennoble, purify, and refine the character, it is without a rival.

God cares for us as intelligent beings, and He has given us His word as a lamp to our feet and a light to our path. Its teachings have a vital bearing upon our prosperity in all the relations of life. Even in our temporal affairs it will be a wiser guide than any other counselor. Its divine instruction points the only way to true success. There is no social position, no phase of human experience, for which the study of the Bible is not an essential preparation.

Man's word fails; and he who takes the assertions of man as his dependence may well tremble; for he will one day be a shipwrecked vessel. But God's word is infallible, and endures forever. Christ declares, "Verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled." God's word will endure through the ceaseless ages of eternity. God lives and reigns. *Advent Review*, Feb. 6, 1900.

Praise God, we have a divine road to heaven. We need not depend upon the conjectures and opinions of men, but upon the infallible decision of the word of God. The word of the infinite God is true, and cannot be distorted to suit men's pleasure, or be turned aside to suit the inclinations of the unsanctified soul. No man can safely judge the word of the Supreme Ruler of the universe. *Signs of the Times*, Aug. 21, 1893.

God's Word is full of precious promises and helpful counsel. It is infallible; for God can not err. It has help for every circumstance and condition of life, and God looks on with sadness when His children turn from it to human aid. *Signs of the Times*, June 26, 1901.

Then let every man read, study, and search the Scriptures for himself and take nothing as infallible but the Word that you can see for yourself, after much prayer and searching in an humble, teachable spirit. *The Ellen G. White 1888 Materials*, p. 835.

The following is an excerpt of Arthur Daniells' remarks at Ellen White's funeral on July 24, 1915, remarks which should resonate with all Biblebelieving Christians today:

"No Christian teacher in this generation, no religious reformer in any preceding age, has placed a higher value upon the Bible. In all her writings it is represented as the book of all books, the supreme and all-sufficient guide for the whole human family. Not a trace of 'higher criticism,' 'new thought,' nor skeptical, destructive philosophy can be found in any of her writings. Those who still believe that the Bible is the inspired, infallible word of the living God will value most highly the positive, uncompromising support given this view in the writings of Mrs. White."—*Life Sketches*, 1915 ed., p. 471, 472.

VEGAN RECIPE CORNER!

RAW CASHEW CHEESE (dip)

Easy Cashew cheese. Not all are alike, but if you hang in these circles, you probably already have the recipe. (Chris and Sarah Hall)

- 1 large red bell pepper, roughly chopped.
- 2 cups raw cashews.
- 1 cup nutritional yeast.
- 2 tablespoons apple cider vinegar.
- 1 clove garlic, optional.
- 1 teaspoon salt.

Just throw all in the VitaMix, and voila, dip!

FALAFELS

1 can chickpeas (drained) 1 onion finely chopped 3 cloves minced garlic 1/2 cup fresh parsley
2 tablespoons coriander powder
2 teaspoons cumin
Pinch of clove powder
1/3 teaspoon cayenne pepper
1/2 cup breadcrumbs
1 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon olive oil
1/4 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
1 tablespoon lemon juice

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Place the drained chickpeas and parsley in a food processor.
- 3. Add all other ingredients, pulse to combine.
- 4. Chill mixture for 30 minutes.
- 5. Shape into small balls.
- 6. Place in a slightly oiled oven tray.
- 7. Bake for 20 minutes, turn once.

LENTIL BALLS

2 cups cooked lentils
1 cup cooked grain (rice, millet, etc)
1 onion finely chopped
250 g mushrooms finely chopped
3 tablespoons flour (chickpea, cake flour, etc)
½ teaspoon oregano
2 tablespoons ground coriander
½ teaspoon ground clove
½ teaspoon paprika
1/3 teaspoon ginger
½ teaspoon salt

Sauté the onion till golden brown Add mushrooms and fry till soft Add all seasoning to onion mix Mix all ingredients Form into balls or patties Bake in oven at 350 degrees 5 minutes on each side (Makes about 40)
